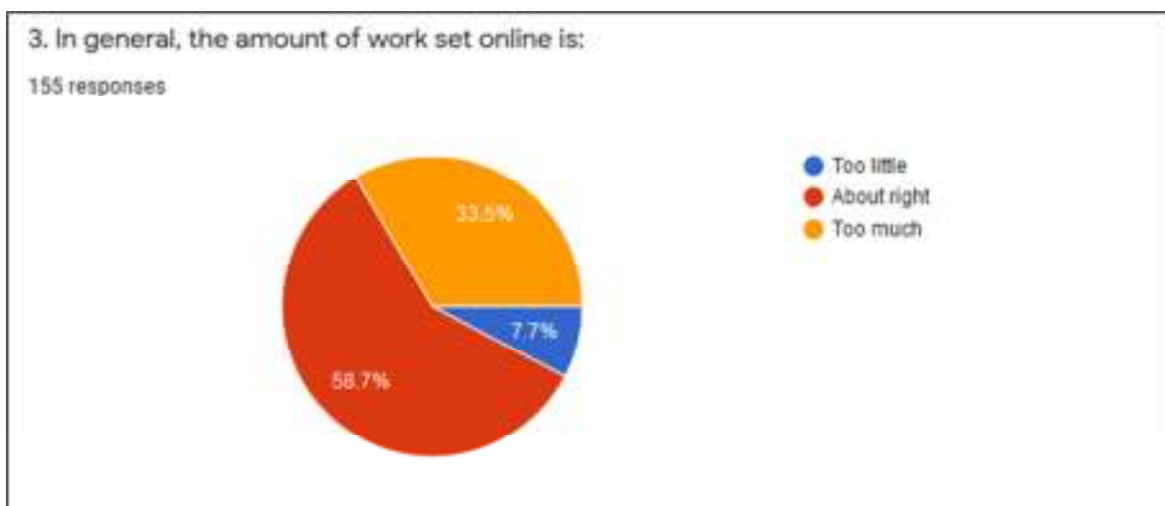
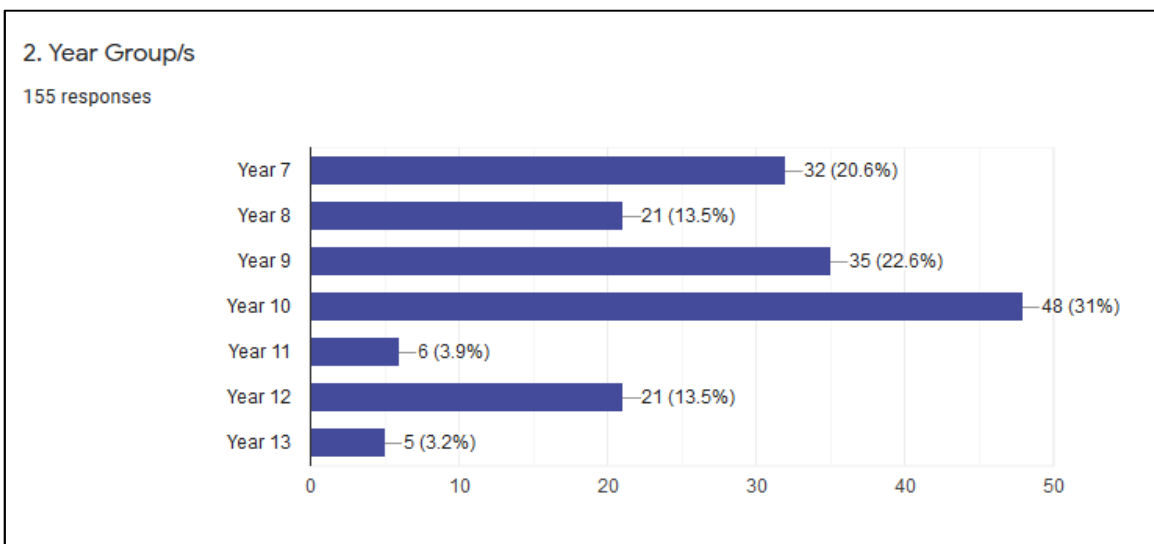
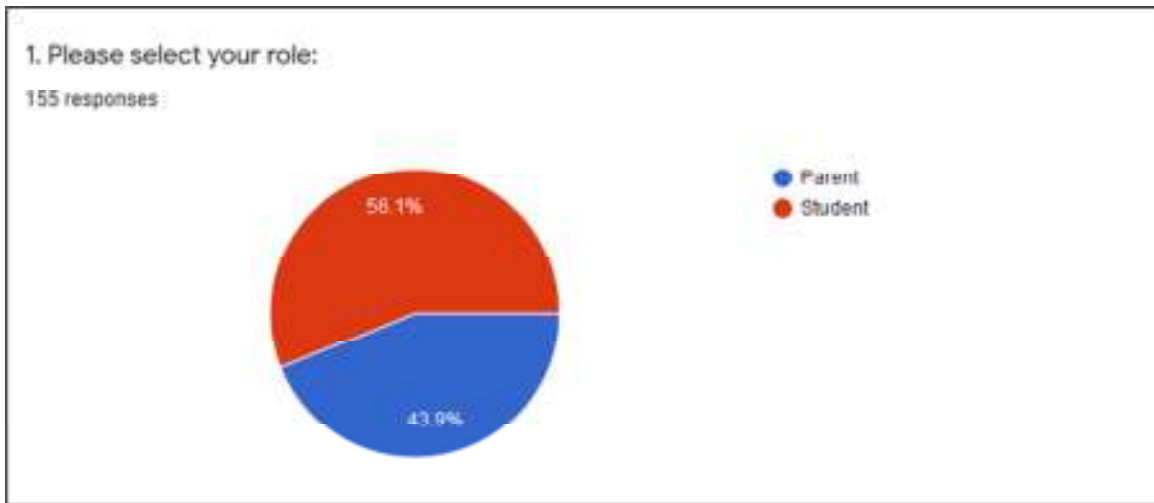




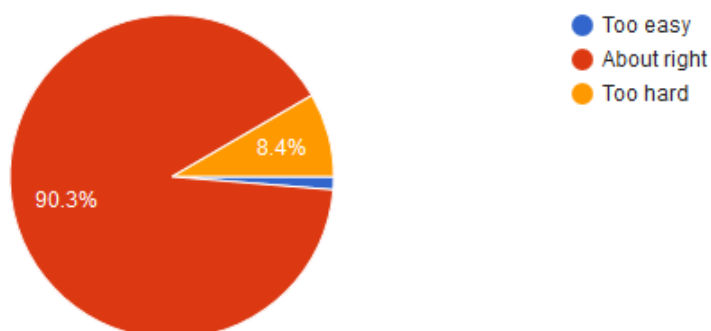
Feedback from Survey on Home Learning and answers to FAQs

FAQs

- **Why can't all my daughter's lessons be live on ZOOM or an equivalent?**
Not all staff or students will have the facility at home to do this. Remember that in many homes PCs or laptops will be shared. This is not a regular 'Working from Home' scenario with established technology in place; this is 'Working from home in a crisis'. We have taken on-board the helpful comments about staff adding voice-overs to presentations and will do this where possible.
- **Why is my daughter not being set work by her usual teacher? (She has to go to another teacher's Google classroom. Is this a supply teacher?)**
In some subjects work will be set for the whole year group by a single teacher in order to ensure consistency of learning as far as possible. Sometimes this may include tasks that have been done previously. Please remember that in subjects such as languages repetition will be very important and can be quite deliberate. None of the teachers setting work are supply teachers.
- **The work being set is so hard. Should I get my daughter a tutor?**
Please don't get a tutor – this should not be necessary. If the work is too hard please let us know, either by getting your daughter to email her teacher, or by sending an email to the Key Stage Coordinator. We will get this adjusted as we get used to a new way of working. In the meantime please follow the advice about reassuring your daughter that was given in the main letter.
- **My daughter is in Year 10 and we are worried that the work set is not appropriate for GCSEs. What should we do?**
Your daughter's teachers will want to ensure that your daughter is well-prepared for her GCSEs: they know the curriculum in detail. Please allow time for the work to develop, encourage your daughter to do what is set and make sure she doesn't worry.
